## CV of Professor Christos V. Gortsos

Christos Gortsos has a tenured position as Professor of Public Economic Law at the Law School of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA). During the Academic Year 2022-2023, he is Visiting Scholar at the Faculty of Law of the University of Zürich and Senior Fellow at the *Collegium Helveticum* (a joint Institute of Advanced Studies of the ETH Zürich, the University of Zürich and the Zürich University of Arts).

Furthermore (among other academic and professional activities):

- 1. since December 2021, he is Member of the Board of Appeal of the European Supervisory Authorities (ESAs) and was elected by that Board's Members as its Vice-President;
- 2. since September 2020, he is a member of the European Parliament's external expert group on technical, regulatory and policy issues in the field of banking resolution;
- 3. since February 2020, he is President of the Academic Board of the Frankfurt-based "European Banking Institute" (EBI);
- 4. since 2015, he is regularly lecturing in postgraduate programs of the Europa Institut Zürich and is Research Partner at the University Research Priority Program (URPP) "Financial Market Regulation" of the University of Zürich; and
- 5. he is Visiting Professor at the Europa Institut of the University of Saarland and at the Frankfurt School of Finance and Management, acting as Academic Director of the EBI LLM Program in "European Banking and Financial Regulation", as well as Series Co-Editor of the "EBI Studies in Banking and Capital Markets Law" (published by Palgrave Macmillan).

Professor Gortsos studied (at both undergraduate and graduate level) law, macroeconomics, finance and international politics and history at the Universities of Athens, Zürich, Pennsylvania (Wharton Business School) and Geneva (Graduate Institute of International Studies). The main fields of his academic activity include international and EU monetary and financial law, central banking law and institutional economics.
